Dear Friend of the Fraternity,

We live in a world of pleasure and comfort. But how often do we experience genuine, lasting joy?

Nowadays, there are countless ways to make our daily duties more convenient and our lives easier. There are also innumerable means of entertaining ourselves—of filling every spare moment with a supposed delight. These diversions, however, pale in comparison to joy.

As St. Thomas Aquinas points out, joy is not among the theological, moral, or intellectual virtues. What, then, is it?

St. Thomas teaches that one cause of joy is love—and more specifically, the presence of a thing we love. If we were to stop here, we might decide that the goods of this world are all we need to remain joyful. But consider how quickly these things perish—and how the human heart longs for lasting joy.

The only such joy is spiritual. St. Thomas helps us again by explaining that the cause of spiritual joy is charity, which is the love of God whose goodness is unchangeable. If, then, we heed the exhortation above to "rejoice heartily," our joy cannot be rooted in the fleeting things of this world! Instead, we must pray that our love of God—and our love of neighbor for God's sake—will increase.

Knowing this, we can begin to understand why one of the best ways to sustain our joy is through proper liturgy, which always has God as its object.
